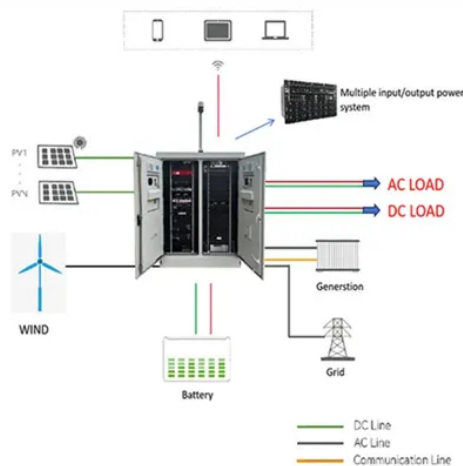


Eritrea electricity generation



Overview

Eritrea has the 32nd lowest net electricity generation among 210 countries with data in 2024. How does Eritrea rank globally for net electricity generation?

Electricity can be generated in two main ways: by harnessing the heat from burning fuels or nuclear reactions in the form of steam (thermal power) or by capturing the energy of natural forces such as the sun, wind or moving water. Electricity production tends to closely match demand, which in turn. In the energy domain, there are many different units thrown around — joules, exajoules, million tonnes of oil equivalents, barrel equivalents, British thermal units, terawatt-hours, to name a few. This can be confusing, and make comparisons difficult. The bar chart shows the proportion of a country's land area in each of these classes and the global distribution of land area across the world at a height of 100m.
